Description

The Buffalo Philharmonic Chorus is an independent symphonic chorus whose mission is to provide the highest quality performances of choral music to the Western New York community while developing singers in the choral arts, through self-sponsored concerts, and as the primary choral partner of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra. The organization was originally founded as the Buffalo Schola Cantorum in 1937 by Jessamine E. Long.

Director Adam Luebke

Adam Luebke was appointed Music Director of the Buffalo Philharmonic Chorus in 2015. Since that time, critics have hailed the chorus as “in top shape,” “virtuosic,” “splendid,” “articulate,” “energetic,” “soaring,” and “joyous.” He is also Assistant Professor of Voice and Conducting at the State University of New York at Fredonia.
